The parent organization "National Association for the Blind" (India) is the largest voluntary Organization for the blind in India, established in 1952 at Mumbai. The Delhi State Branch of NAB came into existence in 1979 at R.K Puram, New Delhi. National Association for the Blind, Delhi is a voluntary organization which was registered under the Societies Registration Act of 1860 on 19<sup>th</sup> April, 1979 and is working in its present premises in R.K. Puram since 1986. Late Mr. Jagdish Kapur and Late Mrs. Vidya Batra were the founder President and Hony. General Secretary of the organization.

NAB Delhi has completed more than 38 years of service for the visually impaired children and persons. It has taken multifarious activities for the visually impaired and children with additional disabilities. At present, NAB Delhi has a staff constituting of 135 members working relentlessly towards the cause that we believe in. ### **MISSION**

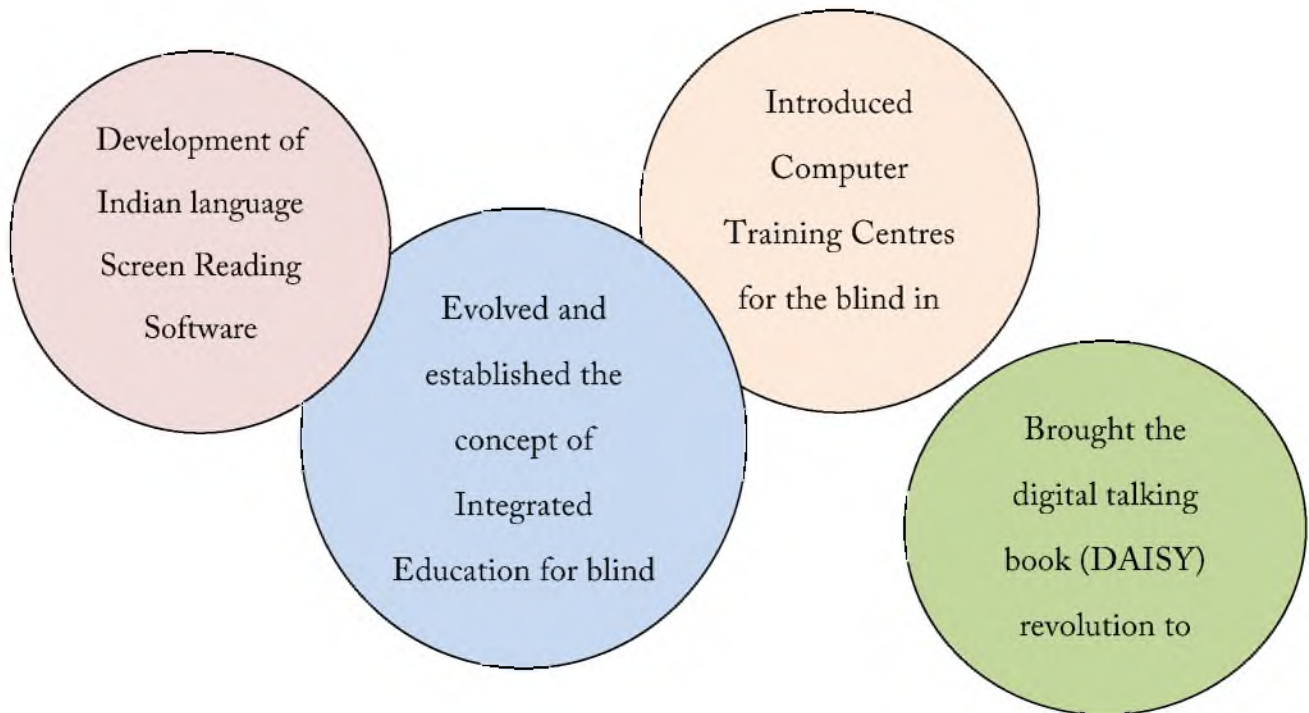

## **ACHIEVEMENTS 2016-17**

### **PRE-INTEGRATION UNIT**

Pre Integration or Preparatory Unit provides the basic foundation skills to children between the age group 4-7 for their eventual integration into mainstream schools. There are about 45 children who are provided intervention by 7 trained educators, Braille instructors, Music Teachers and 2 helpers. The children are trained not only in academics, but also in minute aspects of their life, which eventually promotes independent living. The children are trained in Daily Living Skills, Pre-Braille Skills leading to Reading and Writing Braille/Large Print, Mathematics with the help of Taylor Frame and Abacus and Orientation and Mobility within the school and outside to encourage independent movement. The students are also given keyboard orientation to work on computer with the help of screen-reading software. The students are then identified for integration into schools.

In the year 2016-17, 25 new students were admitted to the Pre Integration Unit and 18 students were admitted into schools such as DPPS, Tagore International, DAV Vasant Kunj, SDM Public School and Kendriya Vidyalayas.

- The students participated in the Annual Day celebration held in the month of April 2016. The theme of the event was India and our children performed on various patriotic songs.
- An Individual Talent Competition was held on 13<sup>th</sup> August, 2016 where each child of the unit performed individually. The theme was expressing love for your nation. They recited a poem, speech or sang a song. A painting competition was also held based on the above theme.
- “Medha” a talent show was organized for a much larger audience and was held on 23<sup>rd</sup> September 2016 at PHD Chambers New Delhi. The children of the unit participated and presented dance and yoga on stage. The tiny tots were appreciated for all their effort.
- Sports day was organized in the month of February, 2017. All the students of the unit participated in different types of races as well as performed yoga asanas.
- The students are actively involved in activities such as Clay Modeling, Drawing and Colouring, Games, Fancy Dress Competition, Poem Recitation, and Story Narration.


## INTEGRATED EDUCATION UNIT

In this unit, the organization enrolls its pre integration students into mainstream schools such as DPS, St. Mary's, Springdales School, Sarvodaya Vidyalaya and Navyug School. Integrated education brings visually impaired and sighted children close to each other from an early age, making them aware of each other's unique potentials and creates better understanding.

In the year 2016-17, 170 students attended mainstream schools.

The Integrated Education Unit conducted the following events:

- 9 students participated in the Very Special Arts Drawing and Painting Competition conducted by Very Special Arts School.
- 10 students of NAB Delhi attended the Yoga workshop conducted by Ms. Nivedita Joshi of Iyengar Yoga Yogakshema on 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> April 2016. The workshop was also held at NAB on 9<sup>th</sup> April 2016 for the other students who had not attended the workshop at the Yoga Centre.
- International Festival of Language and Culture conducted its event in India for the first time on 7<sup>th</sup> May 2016. School students from all around the world presented songs and dance of their region to develop universal harmony and brotherhood. There was live broadcast of this program on DD Bharti. Three talented students from NAB, Ankita Jaiswal, Julie Tiwari and Murad Khan presented a song.
- Dental Camp was organized by the Faculty of Dentistry, Jamia Milia Islamia on 6<sup>th</sup> August 2016. A team of dentists visited NAB and conducted a check up of the students residing in the Hostel. They gave their recommendations for the students and minor jobs like cleaning and filling up cavities were done.
- Independence Day Celebration -
  - I. Energy Efficiency Services Limited had invited 20 students of NAB to their office to participate in the Independence Day Celebration. The students spoke on the work done by NAB for children with visual impairment and presented three patriotic songs.
  - II. Independence Day Celebration at NAB - Independence Day was celebrated at NAB on 15<sup>th</sup> August 2016. The event started with Flag hoisting, followed by patriotic songs. This was followed by cultural events. The students presented two patriotic songs, two dances and a skit on freedom struggle. The skit was on Rani Lakshmi Bai and how boldly she fought against the British for the rights of Indians
- An Eye Camp was conducted by the Lioness Club Srijan on 10<sup>th</sup> September, 2016. The students were examined and prescriptions were given. The students were provided with eye drops.

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- The students of NAB were invited to sing the prayer song in the Golden Jubilee Celebration of Sight Savers on 18<sup>th</sup> September, 2016.
- Medha, A Cultural Program, was conducted on 23<sup>rd</sup> September, 2016. The theme of the program was “Accessible India”, supporting India’s drive towards accessibility. Talents of our students were exhibited in the event. Students from all the units participated in the event. The theme for the cultural program by the students was “Indian festivals”. The old students, who are achievers in their lives, were honoured. Ms. Veena Mehta Verma, Ms. Madhu Sharma, Mr. Diwakar Sharma and Mr. Kartik Sawhney, were honoured. These achievers spoke on the role played by NAB in their achievement. The achievers in music, Ms. Vasundhara Rathuri and Mr. Diwakar Sharma performed on the stage and captivated the crowd.
- NAB practiced Swachhta Abiyaan on 1<sup>st</sup> October, 2016. The students of Preparatory School were told about keeping our surroundings clean. The students of higher classes did a cleaning drive. Areas for cleaning were assigned and the students were provided dusters and brooms. The students cleaned the venue with the help of teachers and other staff.
- The students of NAB were invited to perform in the Annual Day celebration of Ayurved. The students performed Gidda and Yoga. Ayurved donated 4 laptops to the students of NAB.
- 12 students from NAB were invited to participate in the Program for Environment Awareness for School children held at Mirzapur, Varanasi. The themes of the program were Swachh Bharat, water conservation, de-addiction. The participants were taken to Ganga Ghats and sewage treatment plants and were told about how water should be treated before releasing into the river. The students went on a walkathon, shouting slogans in support of conservation of resources and Swachh Bharat. The students of NAB gave a presentation on air, water and soil pollution. The students presented a poem recitation, a dance and two songs. Mimicry by a student was appreciated by all. Their performances were highly appreciated.
- Saksham Inclusive Interschool Computer competition – A speed and Accuracy computer competition was conducted by Saksham on 11<sup>th</sup> November, 2016. Three students of NAB participated in the competition, out of which two girls got 2<sup>nd</sup> (Junior English typing) and 3<sup>rd</sup> prize (Senior Hindi typing).
- 11 students participated in UNESCO painting competition held on 18<sup>th</sup> November, 2016. The participants were given certificates and colouring items.
- National School Chess Championship for the visually challenged 2016 – Held at Shirdi from 22 to 26 November 2016. Two girls got 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> prize (under 16), boys got 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> rank (under 16). NAB got 2<sup>nd</sup> position in this tournament.
- North Zone Chess Tournament – It was held from 12<sup>th</sup> to 14<sup>th</sup> January 2017 at Faridabad. 20 students participated out of which 3 boys and 4 girls were selected and participated for the National Chess Tournament held in Kolkata from 25<sup>th</sup> to 30<sup>th</sup> January 2017.

- Louis Braille Birthday – Competitions were held for the students. The details of the competition are as follows:
  - I. Braille reading and writing competitions were held at NAB on 4<sup>th</sup> January 2017. The students were divided into two groups, Junior and Senior. Reading materials were given to the students and the students were judged on their reading skills.
  - II. Braille writing competition - The Junior students were given dictation and the senior students were given topics to write on.
  - III. Extempore – The students spoke on topics given to them on the spot, both in English and Hindi.
- Modern School Chess Competition – Seven students of NAB participated in a Chess Tournament held at Modern School, Vasant Vihar from 19<sup>th</sup> to 21<sup>st</sup> January 2017.
- NMNH Essay competition was held on 20<sup>th</sup> Jan 2017. 6 students participated in it. 1<sup>st</sup>prize was bagged by Sanjana, Class X, Consolation prize – Devesh Sharma and Shubhanjali Patel.
- Salwan Marathon was held at Salwan Public School, Mayur Vihar on 28<sup>th</sup> March 2017. Students from NAB, Heera Joshi won first prize and Mohini Sharma won third prize among girls, and Abhishek Rai won first prize, Devesh Sharma won second prize and Saqib Mir won third prize among boys.



## **AFTER SCHOOL RESOURCE CENTRE FOR CHILDREN STUDYING IN MAINSTREAM SCHOOLS**

The Centre runs in the NAB facility everyday from 2:30 to 6:30. The Centre's main objective is to help the students with their classwork, homework and revisions. We have highly qualified special educators who teach the children using accessible modes of education for the visually impaired such as Braille, reading to the children, audio books et cetera. It is with the continuous and exemplary efforts of the Centre that our students performed well in their board exams. Their Results are:

## **CENTRE FOR MULTIPLE DISABILITIES**

The unit provides intervention services to the visually impaired children with additional disabilities and deaf blind children since 1997. Individualized educational plan is prepared for each child after detailed assessment. Goals selected cover different areas and commensurate with the child's level. The children are taught various concepts as far as possible through real life experiences. The unit undertakes these activities through multidisciplinary team of special educators and other professionals such as Speech therapist, Mobility Instructor and a Physiotherapist. There are 87 students with visual impairment and multiple disabilities attending classes at the Centre daily.

The activities of the Centre in the year 2016-17 are:

- The Unit put up stalls at Corporates such as Indigo Airlines where the products created by the students were put up for sale.
- Our students participated in Pinkathon, India's biggest women's run with the objective of spreading awareness about women's health related issues on 10<sup>th</sup> September, 2016
- On the occasion of Annual Day of the organization, the children gave a singing performance using sign language.
- Fancy dress competition was held on Teachers' Day.
- On the occasion of Diwali Mela a separate stall of the unit was set-up for sale of products made by children of the unit. The products included Magnet calendars, jewelry, laminated coasters and table mats, macramé bags, candles and diyas.
- 7 students participated at the National Trust Foundation Day and sang the song "Chaar Kadam" in sign language.
- The Annual Sports Day of the unit was held on 27<sup>th</sup> February, 2016. Keeping the Individual child's ability in mind, creative races such as frog race, catch the fish were designed.
- The Centre provided training to 120 students pursuing special education from various institutes like Technia.

### **REGIONAL LEARNING CENTRE FOR DEAFBLINDNESS / MULTI-SENSORY IMPAIRED CHILDREN**

NAB, Delhi with the support from Sense International (India) developed a Regional Learning Centre (North) on DeafBlindness in 2007. The main objective is to sensitize and partner with organizations working in the field of single disability in the Northern Region so as to reach out to as many children as possible. The various training programmes undertaken as well as workshops attended by the staff during the period 2016-2017 are as follows:-

### ***A DREAM COME TRUE***

John was a 4 year old boy from Tamil Nadu when he first came to NAB Delhi. He was diagnosed with Rubella Syndrome led to his loss of vision and hearing impairment.


At NAB, John underwent intervention at the Centre for Multiple Disabilities with a focus on communication and development of self-reliance skills. As a result of the teachers' sustained efforts and John's perseverance, NAB realised that he had the potential to be an entrepreneur. Today, John runs a small Canteen of his own in NAB Delhi's premises.



Regional Training on Multiple Disabilities/ Deafblindness was conducted by the Centre from 9<sup>th</sup> to 14<sup>th</sup> May 2016. The event was supported by Sense International (India). The aim was to strengthen services for children with multi-sensory impairment in northern region. Total of 34 participants from different organizations of Haryana, Punjab, Rajasthan, Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand and Jammu and Kashmir participated in the workshop.

On the occasion of Helen Keller's Day 27<sup>th</sup> June 2016 Sensitisation training on Deafblindness was organised by Regional learning Centre on Deafblindness (North), supported by Sense India, at various places during the Helen Keller week and also in the month of July 2016:

- Sensitization at Udaan, Simla for NGOs, state government officials as well as medical and paramedical staff , parents and special educators on 27<sup>th</sup> June 2016 at Shimla
- Sensitization of ICDS officials, Aaganwadi workers, helpers and volunteers in Delhi on 27<sup>th</sup> June Sensitisation of Resource Organisations of the National Trust at Umang Jaipur on 30<sup>th</sup> June 2016
- Sensitization at Vision Institute Faridabad on 29<sup>th</sup> June for officials, NGO professionals and paramedic staff.
- Sensitisation training for staff of SSA Chandigarh on 13<sup>th</sup> July 2016.
- Regional Network meet of Teachers and Parents-RLC(North) NAB Delhi with the support of Sense International (India) organized Regional Network Meet on 21<sup>st</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup> September 2016 at Delhi, for the members of Abhi-Prerna and Prayaas networks. A total of 52 participants from various organizations of Northern India participated in the workshop.
- Leadership Training: A two Day Regional Capacity Building Workshop for senior professionals in administrative posts, educators, counselors and parents of partner organization in the northern region was held on 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> December 2016 at Delhi. The training was organized by Regional Learning Centre on Deafblindness (North) supported by Sense International India, funded by The Boeing Company at USI Residency Resorts New Delhi. The 2 day training was about understanding and effectively implementing child protection policy, protection and prevention of sexual abuse, POCSO Act 2012, discussion, deliberation and sharing of practical ways of keeping children/young adult safe. The participants were from different organizations from the state of Rajasthan, Himachal Pradesh, Haryana, Punjab and Delhi. Placement opportunities were provided to the students pursuing Diploma in Special Education from Technia Institute Delhi as well as Bachelors in Rehabilitation Therapy (BRT) from Composite Regional Centre (CRC), Srinagar.

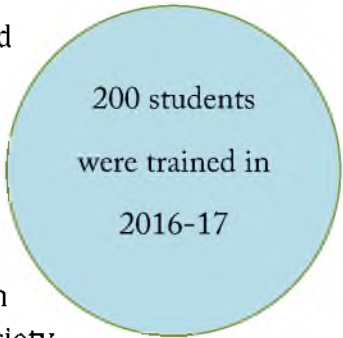

### COMPUTER TRAINING UNIT

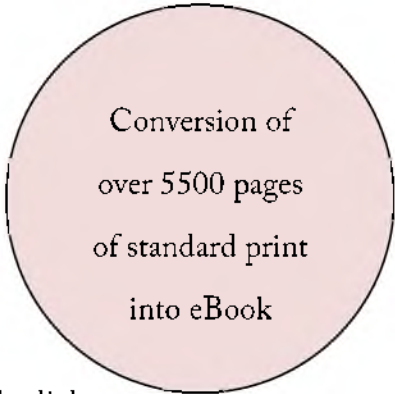
NAB Delhi established the Computer Training Unit for Blind persons in 1993. The unit has since then undergone an evolutionary process, developed and established the concept of computer training for blind persons and its applicability in India. The unit has various training modules to cater to the needs of different categories of educated blind persons. For consistently maintaining high standards, NAB has been accredited by the NIELIT Society, Government of India for conducting their CCC and O Level courses. Total number of beneficiaries from April, 2016 to March, 2017 were 200 students.



### RAM NATH TALKING BOOK LIBRARY

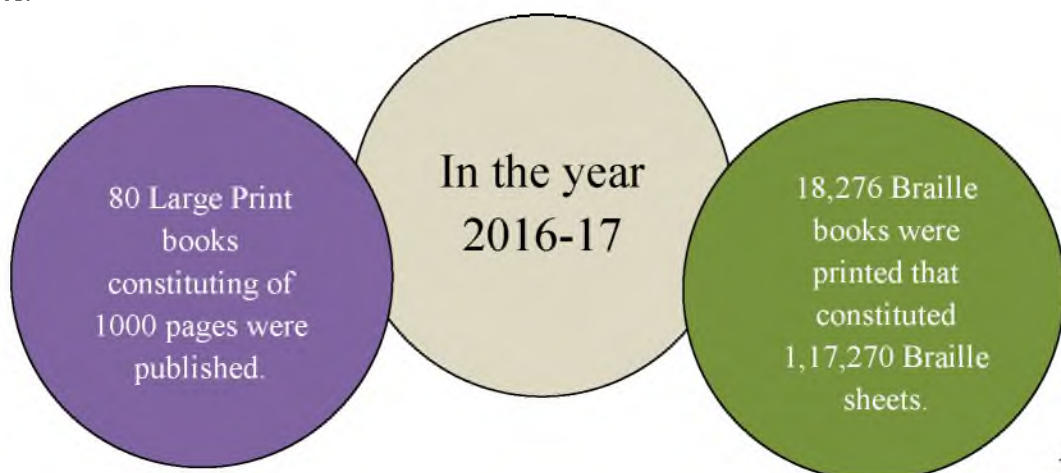
National Association for the Blind has a well established Talking Book or Audio Book Library that was started in the year 1997. In the year 2016-17, the achievements of the Talking Book Library are:

### BRAILLE AND LARGE PRINT UNIT

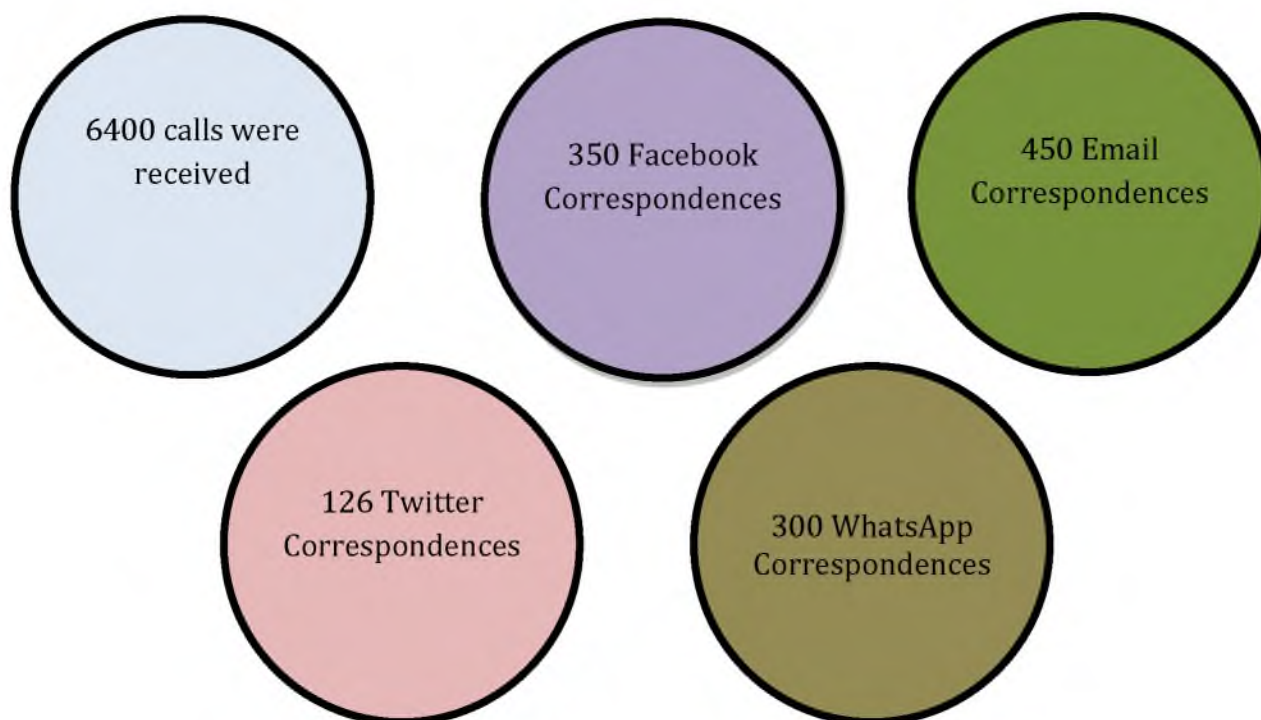

## HELPLINE FOR THE VISUALLY IMPAIRED

NAB Delhi has been operating the Assistive Technology Helpline Service for the visually impaired since September 2006 with the support of HPS Social Welfare Foundation now called "Essel Social Welfare Foundation". The beneficiaries of the project include blind persons, persons with low vision, parents/family/friends of visually impaired persons, employers of visually impaired persons, schools & colleges who have enrolled visually impaired students, organizations working with/for visually impaired persons.

## **HOSTEL FACILITY**

NAB deputed 2 more staff members in the capacity of a helper and an assistant store incharge in the hostel this year. The hostel beds were repaired, new kitchenware was ordered and the existing, repaired.

## **NAB SAROJINI TRILOKNATH AWARD**

NAB Sarojini Triloknath Award is given to an individual for his/her outstanding contribution towards education, welfare or rehabilitation of visually impaired. This year, The Annual Sarojini Triloknath Award Ceremony was held on 3<sup>rd</sup> December 2016. 
